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
Population of Municipality of Mathao reaches 24, 108 mark (Results from 2010 Census of Population and Housing)

The population of Malinao up by 409

The Municipality of Malinao posted a total population of 24, 108 persons as of May 2010 Census of Population and Housing. The population size increased by 409 persons over its 2000 population count of 23, 699. The increase in population count from 2000 to 2010 translated to an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 0.17 percent.

Barangay Rosario has the largest number of population

Among the twenty three (23)barangays comprising the Municipality of Malinao, Barangay Rosario was the most populous with a size making up 9.1 percent of the total municipal population. Barangay Kinalangay Viejo was second with 7.8 percent share, closely followed by Bulabud with 7.3, Poblacion with 6.9, and Liloan with 6.1 percent. The rest of the barangays contributed 5.9 percent and below. The least populated area was Barangay Capataga with 0.5 percent share of the total population of the municipality.



Osman was the fastest growing barangay in population size

Among the 23 barangays, Osman was the fastest growing barangay having a population growth rate of 2.44 percent. This growth is almost fiften times the rate of the municipal level (0.17 percent) and almost twice the rate of the provincial level (1.73 percent). Following Osman

is Brgy. Capataga with 2.38 percent, Cabayugan with 2.29 percent, Kinalangay Nuevo with 1.58, and San Roque with 0.96 percent.


On the other hand, ten barangays exhibited negative growth rate during the period 2000 to 2010. These are Brgy. Dangcalan (-2.09), San Dimas (-1.54), Malandayon (-0.95), Sugnod (-0.67), Kinalangay Viejo (-0.58), Poblacion (-0.55), Sipac (-0.43), Biga-a (-0.41), Bulabud (-0.20), and Cogon (-0.09).

Average household size stands at 4.7 persons

The number of households in 2010 was households compared with 4, recorded 5, 112 higher by 731 381 households posted in 2000.

The average household size of Malinao in 2010 is 4.7 persons, lower than that in 2000 which is 5.4 persons.



Children aged 15 to 19 years comprised the biggest group of Malinao's populace

As of 2010, children aged 15 to 19 dominated the municipality with 11.0 percent share of the total household population. This was followed by 10 to 14 years old with 10.6 percent, and 5 to 9 years old with 10.1 percent. This made the age structure of the household population of Malinao to deviate from the usual pyramid shape, as population decreases so age increases.

Of the 24, 086 household population in 2010, there were about 7, 228 or 30.0 percent under 15 years of age. Children

Sex ratio was 105 males per 100 females

Of the 24, 086 household population in 2010, males accounted 51.3 percent while females comprised 48.7 percent. These figures resulted in a sex ratio of 105 males for every 100 females. In 2000, male population outnumbered thier female counterparts with

below 5 years old comprised 9.3 percent of the household population in the municipality. Children aged 5 to 9 years accounted for 10.1 percent while those aged 10 to 14 years comprised 10.6 percent.

In terms of the distribution by age and sex, males outnumbered females in age groups 0 to 44, and 50 to 59 years old while females dominated males in the age group 45 to 49, and 60 years old and over.

sex ratio of 102 males per 100 females.

Children under 15 years old had a sex ratio of 111 males for every 100 females, while for those aged 15 to 64 years had a sex ratio of 109 males for every 100 females. However, the sex ratio for the age group 65 years old and over was 68 males per 100 females, showing a higher mortality of males than females in this age group.

Median age increases to 24 years

In 2010, the median age of Malinao's population was 24 years, which means that half of the household population was younger than 24 years. This further shows that Malinao lhas predominantly vouna population. The 2010 median age is higher than the median age of 21 years recorded in 2000. The municipality's median age for males in 2010 is 23 years, while that for females is 24 years.

Malinao's school age population accounted 41.2 percent

In 2010, the school-age population (5 to 24 years old) in Malinao comprised of 41.2 percent of the 24, 086 household population. By comparison, the school-age population in 2000 was 44.7 percent of the 23, 674 household population. Of the population who were of school age, the males made up 52.7 percent, while females comprised 47.3 percent.

Dependency ratio of Malinao was 61

The overall dependency ratio of Malinao was 61, which indicates that for every 100 working-age population, there were about 61 dependents. This is lower than the dependency ratio in 2000 recorded at 70 dependents per 100 working-age population.

Senior citizens in Malinao comprise 11.4 percent

In Malinao, senior citizen comprised 11.4 percent of the total household population in 2010, which is higher than the 9.7 percent recorded in year 2000. Among the senior citizens, females outnumbered the males with 57.4 percent and 42.6 percent, respectively.

Voting age population constitutes 63.3 percent

The voting-age population (18 years old and over) accounted for 63.3 percent of the entire household population in the municipality. Of the voting-age population, 50.5 percent were males and 49.5 percent were females.

Ageing index in Malinao recorded at 26.4 percent

In Malinao, the ageing index or the proportion of persons aged 60 years and over per 100 persons under the age of 15 years was computed at 26.4 percent in 2010. This means that there are 26 persons aged 60 years and over for every 100 children under 15 years old. In 2000, the ageing index is lower computed at 20.5 percent.

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TECHNICAL NOTES

Growth rate – the amount of increase that a specific variable has gained within a specific period and context

Total population – all usual residents of the country or all person present in the country at the time of census.

Household – is a social unit consisting of a person or a group of persons who sleep in the same housing unit and have common arrangements in the preparation and consumption of food.

Household population – refers to all persons who are members of the household.

Average household size – is the average number of persons who live in the household, computed as the household population in a given area divided by the corresponding total number of households in that area.

Median age – is the age that divides the population into two numerically equal groups, that is, half of the population are younger than this age and the other half are older.

Sex ratio – is the number of males per one hundred females in a given population.

Overall dependency ratio – is the number of persons under 15 years old (young dependents) and persons aged 65 and older (old dependents) per one hundred persons 15 to 64 years old (working-age group).

Ageing index – is calculated as the number of persons 60 years old and over per one hundred person under the age of 15 years.

The 2010 Census of Population and Housing (2010 CPH) was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority (formerly National Statistics Office) in May-June 2010 pursuant to Batas Pambansa Blg. 72 and Commonwealth Act 591. The 2010 CPH was designed to take an inventory of the population and housing units in the Philippines nationwide and to collect information about their characteristics. Information on the count of the population and living quarters were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2010 as the census reference time and date.

The population counts proclaimed by the President as official for all purposes were based on census questionnaires accomplished by the enumerators all over the country. Questionnaires were processed in Census Processing Centers using the Optimal Mark Recognition (OMR) technology along with the Census Integrated Processing System developed by NSO.
