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Population of Municipality of Tangalan reaches 20,277 mark

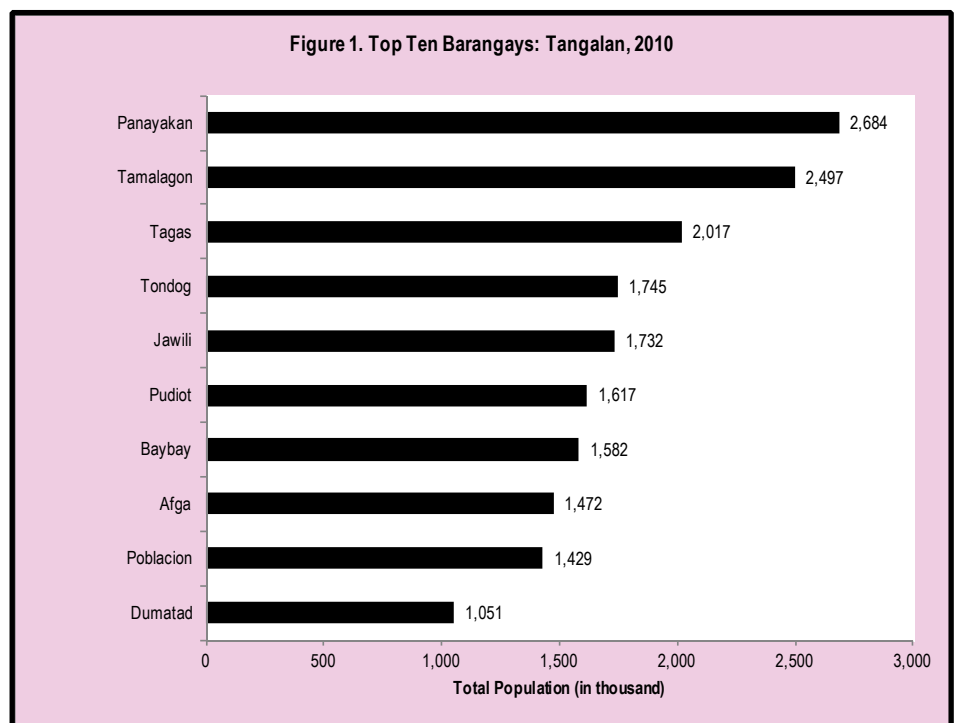
(Results from 2010 Census of Population and Housing)

The population of Tangalan up by more than two thousand

The Municipality of Tangalan posted a total population of 20,277 persons as of May 2010 Census of Population and Housing. The population size increased by 2,671 persons over its 2000 population count of 17,606. The increase in population count from 2000 to 2010 translated to an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 1.42 percent.

Barangay Panayakan has the largest number of population

Among the fifteen (15) barangays comprising the Municipality of Tangalan, Barangay Panayakan was the most populous with a size making up 13.2 percent of the total municipal population. Barangay Tamalagon was the second with 12.3 percent share, followed by Tagas with 9.9, Tondog with 8.6, and Jawili with 8.5 percent. The rest of the barangays contributed 8.0 percent and below. The least populated area was Barangay Tamokoe with 1.1 percent share of the total population of the municipality.



Napatag was the fastest growing barangay in population size

Among the 15 barangays, Napatag was the fastest growing barangay having a population growth rate of 2.63 percent. This growth is almost twice the rate of the municipal level (1.95 percent) and provincial level (1.73 percent). Following Napatag is Brgy. Jawili with 2.18

percent, Panayakan with 2.15 percent, Afga with 1.79, and Dapdap with 1.78 percent.

On the other hand, of the total barangays, only Brgy. Lanipga (-0.10) showed negative growth rate during the period 2000 to 2010.

Average household size stands at 4.8 persons

The number of households in 2010 was recorded 4, 263 higher by 946 compared with 3, 317 households posted in 2000.

The average household size of Tangalan in 2010 is 4.8 persons, lower than that in 2000 which is 5.3 persons.

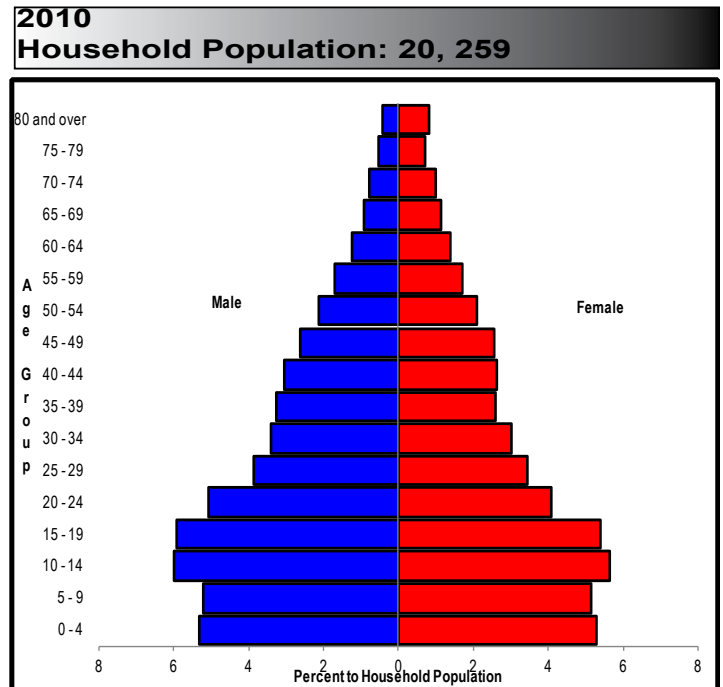
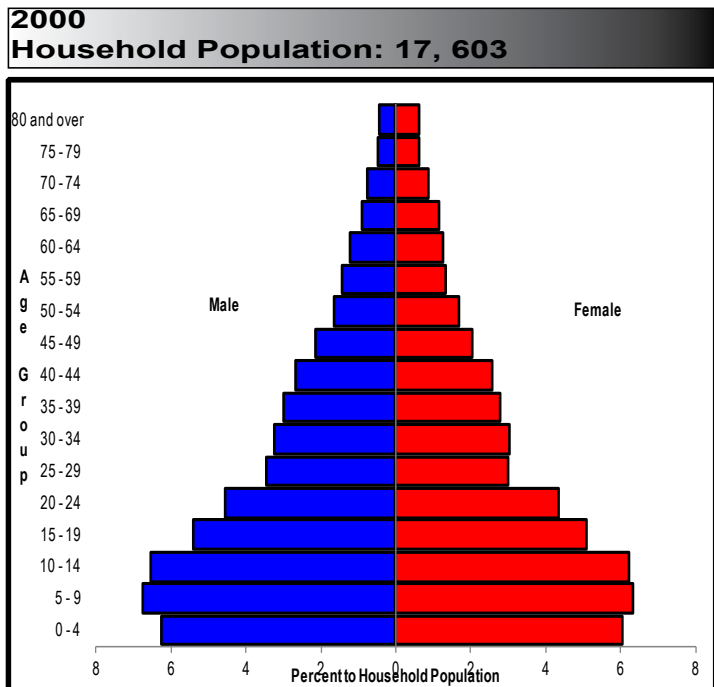


Figure 2. Age-Sex Pyramid of Household Population: Tangalan

Children aged 10 to 14 years comprised the biggest group of Tangalan’s populace

As of 2010, children aged 10 to 14 dominated the municipality with 11.62 percent share of the total household population. This was followed by 15 to 19 years old with 11.34 percent, and 0 to 4 years old with 10.60 percent. This made the age structure of the household population of Tangalan to deviate from the usual pyramid shape, as population decreases so age increases.

Of the 20, 259 household population in 2010, there were about 6, 601 or 32.6 percent

Sex ratio was 106 males per 100 females

Of the 20, 259 household population in 2010, males accounted 51.4 percent while females comprised 48.6 percent. These figures resulted in a sex ratio of 106 males for every 100 females. In 2000, male population slightly outnumbered thier female counterparts with a

under 15 years of age. Children below 5 years old comprised 10.6 percent of the household population in the municipality, while children aged 5 to 9 years accounted for 10.4 percent.

In terms of the distribution by age and sex, males outnumbered females in age groups 0 to 54 years old, while females dominated males in the age group 55 years old and over.

sex ratio of 104 males per 100 females.

Children under 15 years old had a sex ratio of 103 males for every 100 females, while for those aged 15 to 64 years had a sex ratio of 111 males for every 100 females. However, the sex ratio for the age group 65 years old and over was 72 males per 100 females, showing a higher mortality of males than females in this age group.

Median age increases to 22 years

In 2010, the median age of Tangalan population was 22 years, which means that half of the household population was younger than 22 years. This further shows that Tangalan has predominantly young population. The 2010 median age is higher than the median age of 20 years recorded in 2000. The municipality’s median age for both males and females in 2010 was 22 years.

Tangalan’s school age population accounted 42.5 percent

In 2010, the school-age population (5 to 24 years old) in Tangalan comprised 42.5 percent of the 20, 259 household population. By comparison, the school-age population in 2000 was 45.3 percent of the 17, 603 household population. Of the population who were of school age, the males made up 52.3 percent, while females comprised 47.7 percent.

Dependency ratio of Tangalan was 64

The overall dependency ratio of Tangalan was 64, which indicates that for every 100 working-age population, there were about 64 dependents. This is lower than the dependency ratio in 2000 recorded at 79 dependents per 100 working-age population.

Senior citizens in Tangalan comprise 8.9 percent

In Tangalan, senior citizen comprised 8.9 percent of the total household population in 2010, which is higher than the 8.3 percent recorded in year 2000. Among the senior citizens, females outnumbered the males with 56.7 percent and 43.3 percent, respectively.

Voting age population constitutes 60.6 percent

The voting-age population (18 years old and over) accounted for 60.6 percent of the entire household population in the municipality. Of the voting-age population, 51.7 percent were males and 48.3 percent were females.

Ageing index in Tangalan recorded at 19.3 percent

In Tangalan, the ageing index or the proportion of persons aged 60 years and over per 100 persons under the age of 15 years was computed at 19.3 percent in 2010. This means that there are 19 persons aged 60 years and over for every 100 children under 15 years old. In 2000, the ageing index is lower computed at 15.3 percent.

TECHNICAL NOTES

Growth rate – the amount of increase that a specific variable has gained within a specific period and context

Total population – all usual residents of the country or all person present in the country at the time of census.

Household – is a social unit consisting of a person or a group of persons who sleep in the same housing unit and have common arrangements in the preparation and consumption of food.

Household population – refers to all persons who are members of the household.

Average household size – is the average number of persons who live in the household, computed as the household population in a given area divided by the corresponding total number of households in that area.

Median age – is the age that divides the population into two numerically equal groups, that is, half of the population are younger than this age and the other half are older.

Sex ratio – is the number of males per one hundred females in a given population.

Overall dependency ratio – is the number of persons under 15 years old (young dependents) and persons aged 65 and older (old dependents) per one hundred persons 15 to 64 years old (working-age group).

Ageing index – is calculated as the number of persons 60 years old and over per one hundred person under the age of 15 years.

The 2010 Census of Population and Housing (2010 CPH) was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority (formerly National Statistics Office) in May-June 2010 pursuant to Batas Pambansa Blg. 72 and Commonwealth Act 591. The 2010 CPH was designed to take an inventory of the population and housing units in the Philippines nationwide and to collect information about their characteristics. Information on the count of the population and living quarters were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2010 as the census reference time and date.

The population counts proclaimed by the President as official for all purposes were based on census questionnaires accomplished by the enumerators all over the country. Questionnaires were processed in Census Processing Centers using the Optimal Mark Recognition (OMR) technology along with the Census Integrated Processing System developed by NSO.
